We will be raffling off a \$50 Amazon Gift Card to celebrate National Library Week and "Finding Your Place at the Library" theme.






Village facilities have re-opened to the public!





Looking for a way to volunteer in your community?

Education Referendum Question on the Nov. 8th Ballot

"Shall the limiting rate under the Property Tax Extension Limitation Law for Homewood School District Number 153, Cook County, Illinois, be increased by an additional amount equal to 1.20% above the limiting rate for the purpose of funding increased educational and other school district expenses for levy year 2020 and be equal to 5.610% of the equalized assessed value of the taxable property therein for levy year 2022?"

District 153 Seeks First Limiting Rate Tax Increase Since 1992

Homewood voters will see a school funding referendum on their Nov. 8th ballots.

There are many factors that research tells us are essential to providing kids with a high quality education. Those factors include having trained and committed teachers, low class sizes, superior support for those students who need extra help and for those who need more vigorous challenges, and a full menu of activities to enrich students' minds, bodies and social development.


These are the hallmarks of Homewood Schools. Yet over the years, 153 has needed to spend more than it takes in to provide this level of service to our community's children.

District 153 receives only 65% of the

funding the state says we need to provide a high quality education, and school revenues have increased at a slower pace than expenses year after year. The gap between them is our annual (structural) deficit, which has averaged around -\$1.4M since FY2010-11. (See chart below.)

Referendum approvals in 2011 and 2016 provided funding to temporarily fill the gap between revenues and expenditures. The 2022 referendum, if approved, would create a more long-term fix and allow District 153 to:

- eliminate structural deficits
- · maintain services for kids
- build a healthy "rainy day" fund halance
- · address school facility needs
